

SINGULAR SUBJECT PRONOUNS AND SER

The verb ser means "to be." Here are the singular pronouns in Spanish and the corresponding forms of ser:

yo soy	I am
tú eres	you (familiar) are.
él es	he is
ella es	she is
usted es	you (formal) are

EX: Ella es una mujer. = She is a woman.
Yo soy doctor. = I am a doctor.

Tú eres de Cuba. = You are from Cuba.
Ud. es maestra. = You are a teacher.

PLURAL SUBJECT PRONOUNS AND SER

The verb *ser* means "to be." Here are the plural pronouns in Spanish and the corresponding forms of *ser*:

nosotros somos	we are
vosotros sois	you all (familiar) are
ellos son	they (masculine) are
ellas son	they (feminine) are
ustedes son	you all (familiar and formal) are

EX: *Ellas son mujeres.* = They are women. *Uds. son de Cuba.* = You all are from Cuba.
Nosotros somos doctores. = We are doctors. *Ellos son chicos.* = They are boys.
